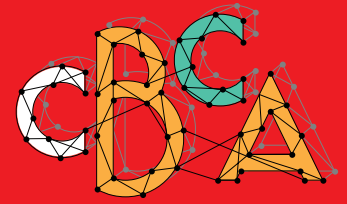

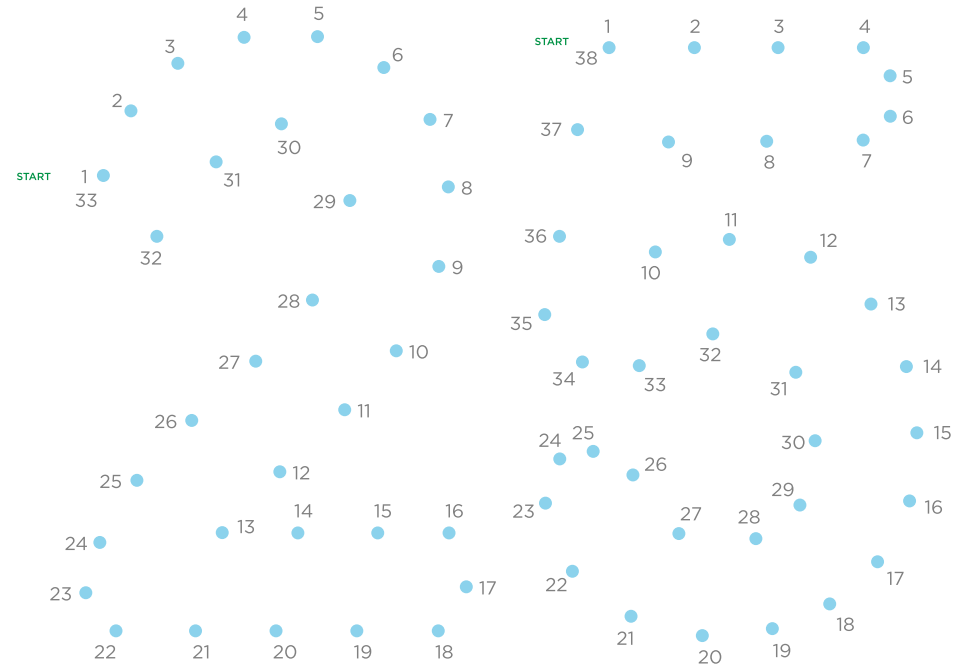

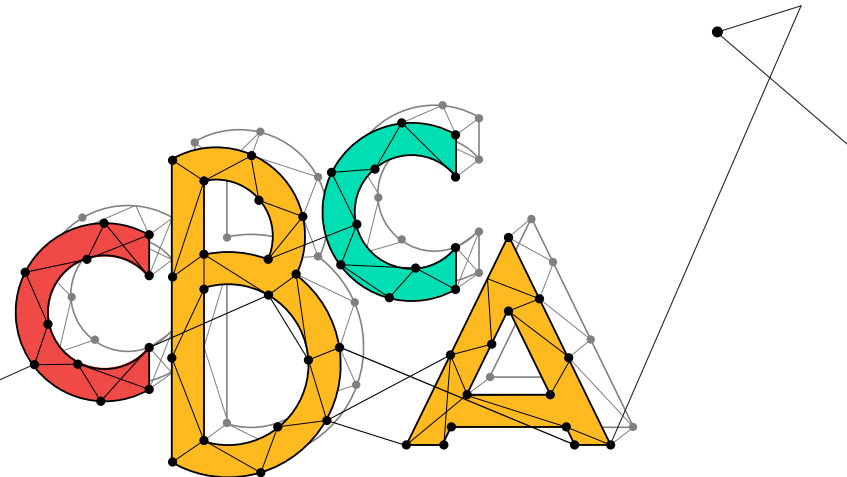
Fort Greene Bar

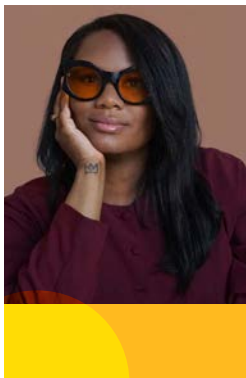
The **NEXT WAVE LEADERSHIP AWARD** honors rising professionals who are leading the future of our cultural community.

Bala Thiagarajan, PhD, is an artist and the founder of Colorado South Asian Artists Group (C-SAAG) who fostered inclusion during her time in CBCA's Leadership Arts 2024 cohort and beyond. In early 2025, Bala launched C-SAAG, a collective of multidisciplinary artists with ancestral ties to South Asia, in order to increase representation and build community. Under Bala's leadership, C-SAAG has hosted two acclaimed group shows, supported the Governor's first Diwali celebration, and has several more exhibits planned.

Named for CBCA's founding chairman, the **JOHN MADDEN, JR. LEADERSHIP AWARD** recognizes a lifetime of extraordinary leadership and a legacy of support for the arts.

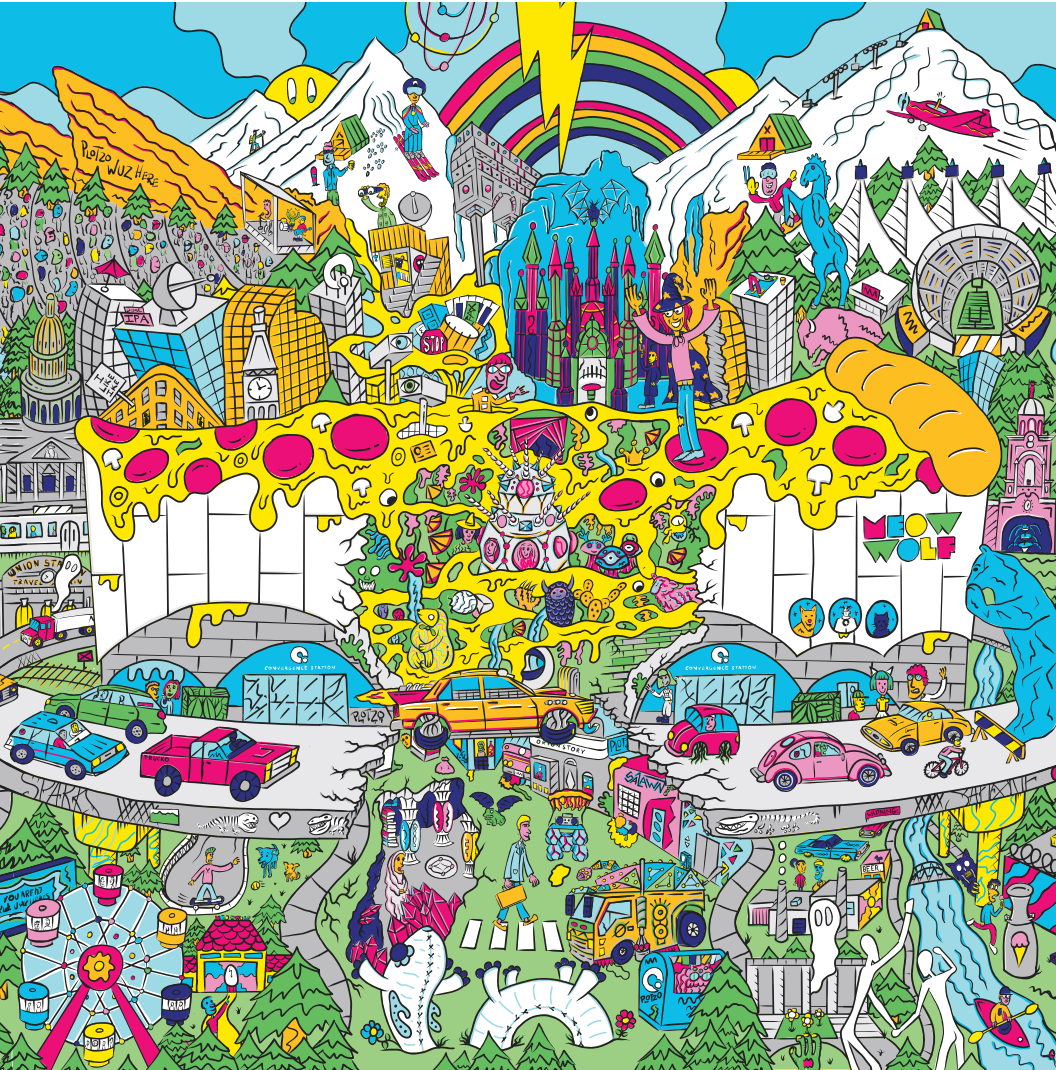
Rocky Mountain Rhythm
